The First World War plays a fundamental role in the national memory of Australia and Gallipoli and continues to resonate strongly for Australians. In the Middle East, present conflicts are a legacy of unresolved conflicts from a hundred years ago and in recent years the stigmatisation, extreme violence, genocide and human trafficking that were widespread during the First World War, have been restaged in Northern Iraq and Syria.

Long Shadows: the Great War, Australia and the Middle East brings together the past with present history to highlight lesser-known experiences of the war in the Middle East that continue to cast long shadows. With texts, clips and evocative photographs, the exhibition leads the visitor from Australia to Gallipoli, Asia Minor and Northern Syria, from 1915 to 2018.
